SHOOTING ASSIGMENT – WORKING WITH THE ENVIRONMENT



The environment has been a major concern for at least the past 50 years. Our main reason for concern is the impact of our consumerist lifestyles on the environment. We are living in a critical time of history because if we do not try to consciously preserve our environment, it will deteriorate to the point where it will no longer be capable of sustaining human life.

You may edit your image by using Photoshop however you see fit. If there is a technique you would like to use, but do not know how, please let me know and I will show you how to create that effect.

Two of the best images will be submitted to the "Working with the Environment" Art Show and Silent Auction. These photographs will be displayed at Devonshire Mall and Mackenzie Hall. Students whose work is chosen will be asked to attend a reception for the show. There is a chance of earning a cash prize for winning photographs.
